- In established cuisines: Southern cooking, Southern cuisine
- Organization names: **Southern** Historical Association
- Publications & titles: Southern Living magazine

X DO NOT CAPITALIZE "southern" WHEN:

- Simple compass direction: Drive south
- General descriptor: The **southern** part of town
- Referring to hemispheres: southern hemisphere
- General adjective: southern exposure
- General style reference: **southern**-inspired decor
- General food description: **southern**-style barbecue

III PROPER NOUN FORMS (Capitalize)

The **Southern** United States has a rich musical heritage.

She graduated from **Southern** Methodist University.

The **Southern** Baptist Convention held their annual meeting.

We visited the **South Carolina Lowcountry** for vacation.

He plans a road trip through the **Southern** Appalachians.

CULTURAL & FOOD REFERENCES (Capitalize)

Southern hospitality makes visitors feel welcome.

His book explores **Southern** literature of the 20th century.

Southern cuisine is famous for its comfort foods.

She specializes in traditional **Southern** baking.

We enjoyed authentic South Carolina shrimp and grits.

Tennessee whiskey adds flavor to **Memphis**-style barbecue sauce.

The **Louisiana** gumbo recipe has been in my family for generations.

COMPASS DIRECTIONS (Don't Capitalize)

We're heading south for winter.

The storm is moving in a **southern** direction.

The **southern** border of the property needs new fencing.

She lives in the **southern** part of Atlanta.

If you drive south from Washington, D.C., you'll reach Richmond.

HEMISPHERES (Don't Capitalize)

In the **southern** hemisphere, the seasons are opposite.

Countries in the **southern** hemisphere include Australia and Chile.

The **Southern** United States experiences milder winters than countries in the **southern** hemisphere.

SOUTHEASTERN

Capitalize as proper noun: **Southeastern** Conference (SEC)

Capitalize as formal region: Southeastern United States

Don't capitalize as direction: southeastern corner of Wyoming Don't capitalize as general area: southeastern coast of Spain

SOUTHBOUND

Capitalize in proper names: Southbound Express Train Don't capitalize as direction: Take the southbound lane

X Don't capitalize as general term: The **southbound** migration of birds

CIVIL WAR REFERENCES

Capitalize entities: The **South** seceded from the Union

Capitalize sides: The North's industrial capacity

Capitalize cultural groups: Southern plantation owners

X Don't capitalize directions: Armies marched south

Don't capitalize general descriptions: northern factories to southern battlefields

SOUTHERN HOSPITALITY

Capitalize "Southern": Southern hospitality (cultural concept)

X Don't capitalize "hospitality": **Southern** hospitality, not **Southern Hospitality**

FOOD REFERENCES

CAPITALIZE:

Southern cuisine features abundant fresh vegetables.

She specializes in traditional **Southern** baking.

Southern fried chicken is a comfort food staple.

South Carolina shrimp and grits

DON'T CAPITALIZE:

The restaurant serves **southern**-style barbecue.

She adds a **southern** twist to classic Italian dishes.

The cookbook features southern-inspired recipes.

eal PRO TIPS FOR SOUTHERN WRITERS

- When referring to the American Civil War, "the South" and "the North" are always capitalized
- Place names are always capitalized (Charleston, Savannah, New Orleans)
- Be consistent within your publication if you decide to capitalize something unusual, maintain that style throughout
- When in doubt about a specific Southern term, check how reputable Southern publications like
 Southern Living or the Atlanta Journal-Constitution handle it
